What laws apply to mobility scooters?

Mobility scooters are legally defined as 'wheeled mobility devices'.

You don't need a driver licence to operate a wheeled mobility device, and they are not required to have a warrant of fitness or registration. There are, however, some important legal safety requirements you need to know about:



- You must operate your mobility scooter or power chair in a careful and considerate manner.
- You must use the footpath, when it is readily accessible, and stay close to the side of the road when a footpath is not readily accessible.
- When on the footpath, you must not travel at a speed that endangers others.
- It's illegal for you to ride, or let any person ride, your mobility scooter or power chair in a way that may cause you or them injury. (Mobility Scooters are not toys for children to use—they have caused death and injury).
- If you are involved in a crash, you must stop to see if anyone is injured, help anyone who is injured, and report the crash to the Police within 24 hours.

It's important to be aware that careless use of a mobility scooter or power chair carries legal implications.

For example, operating a wheeled mobility device carelessly, inconsiderately or at a hazardous speed can result in a fine of up to \$1000.

Seniors Driving Course

Have you kept up with changes to the road code? Age Concern New Zealand, together with NZ Transport Agency, will be holding free refresher courses for older drivers across urban, rural, and remote areas in NZ. The theory-based programme, called 'Staying Safe', is designed to enhance your knowledge, assess your current driving

behaviour, and build confidence. Staying Safe is four-hours of classroom -based learning and is interactive, answering any questions you might have. Everyone who attends will be issued with a certificate and will also be given a workbook to take away.

Please see Onj in the Administration Office if you haven't already put your name down. SuperGold card holders and Maori or Pasifika drivers over 60 are eligible.
